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

For the design aspect of this programme pupils have been learning about trainer design and have explored the world of compostable trainers, trainers inspired by bean bags and trainers made entirely by waste materials.

They've had the opportunity to design and create their own personal trainers using spray paint techniques, hydro dipping, drawing and decorating in jewels. They have enjoyed this project, been engaged and full of creative ideas.

Engineering

If you've ever taken a look at the structures all around us and wondered why certain shapes



and formations are repeated everywhere, then this term's Engineering course was for you! Pupils studied the forces at play in engineered structures, such as compression, tension and torsion, and we delved deep into the geometry of the humble triangle to find out why it's always stronger than a square. This entailed building some toothpick and winegum structures that were miraculously strong enough to hold up "The Brick of Destiny!". We looked at arches, and bridges, and we built structures from Lego which could take the weight of even our heftiest staff members. The term culminated in pupils designing and building their very own lollipop bridges, which put all the theory they had covered into practice.

Consoletopia

GRW and GR6 gathered for our first Consoletopia of the year during the first half term. The event is a chance for pupils to socialise over video games after school and take part in some healthy virtual competition. They had a great time and we plan to replicate the event every term!

GR6

The opening term of this year's GR6 program has been actionpacked. It started with moving into our enhanced GR6 facilities following the renovation of The Coach House at The Swan, giving us a Tech Suite, our brand new, all singing, dancing IT facility. The bright, atmospherically-controlled room has proved a stunning addition to our provision, and in terms of teaching spaces is a firm favourite among the pupils. As homely as our new space is at The Swan, pupils have ventured out - tentatively at first - around ancient Clewer village, then wider Windsor, with their history hunts. Later in the term they visited Windsor Auctions to get some expert advice, before being immersed in the wheeler dealer world of antiques and







curios at Sunbury Antiques fair. Pupils bought some pieces to auction later this month as part of their Bargain Hunt project. Alongside all that, pupils have devised and filmed their own game shows, set up a YouTube channel for the Market Garden. harvested countless boxes of fresh veg, and sold that produce at several Sunday markets at The Swan. On Thursdays, both pupils and staff donned their green Swan polo t-shirts and opened the pub up to members of the community, serving barista-quality coffee and their own home-baked goods. We invited these guests to take a tour of the provision and give us their views on what became "Epic Thursdays" - a regular slot where GR6 pupils welcome the community into the pub, providing some much-needed brightness for the community developing their hospitality and customer service

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skills at the same time. If all that sounds like a lot, then you won't believe what else we got up to; namely planning, designing and creating the

first annual GR6 Halloween Spooktacular. This event was the brainchild of the pupils, who wanted to scare the living daylights out of the lower school kids in their very own Haunted House! GR6's Bargain Hunt project came to a profitable end last week, with all of the items that were purchased by the students at Sunbury Antiques Market finding buyers!! Thanks



Coffee Corner


