shone in these positions and have made a name for themselves in the Green Room Sports hall of fame!

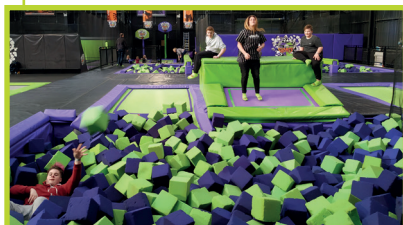
Esports
